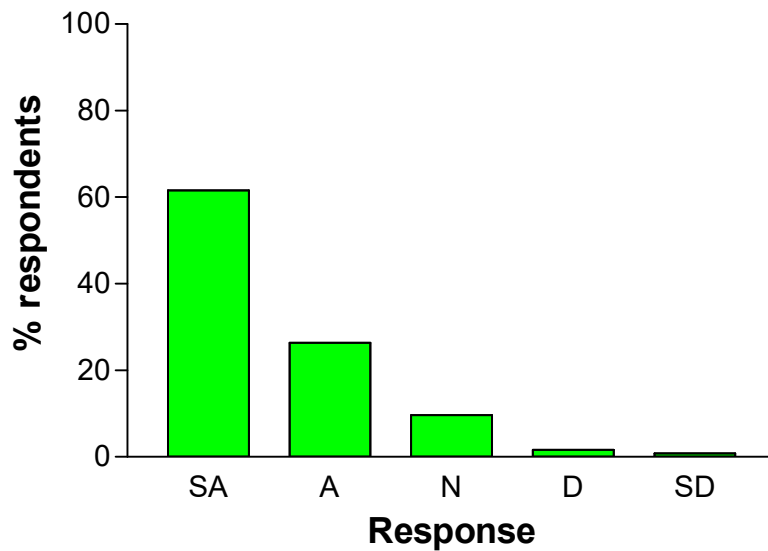


Keep it green

The network of ALL the nature reserves in and around Cape St Francis must be safeguarded now and in the future

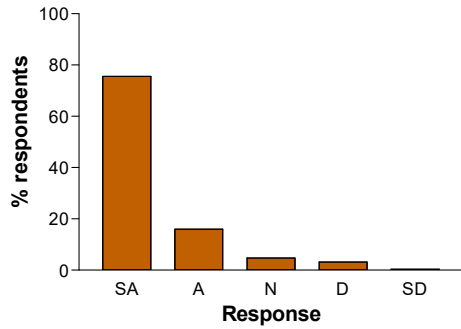


The network of nature reserves should be expanded westwards of the village boundary

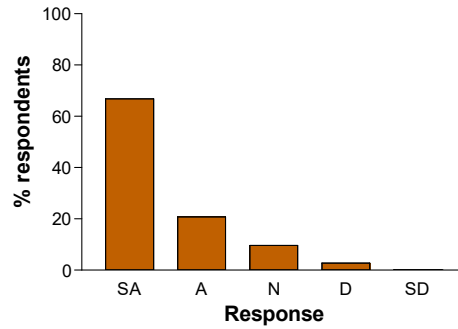


Keep it clean 1

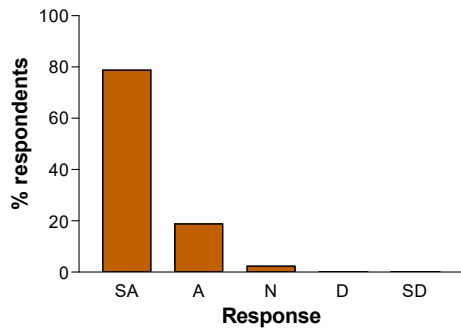
Existing regulations for residential sites should be enforced and no changes from residential to business zoning should be allowed



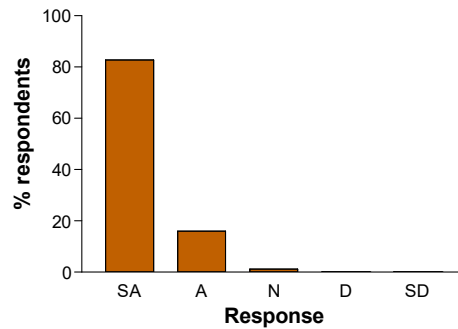
Existing regulations which restrict commercial signage to business sites should be enforced



Building in the village should be well-managed and restricted to the building site

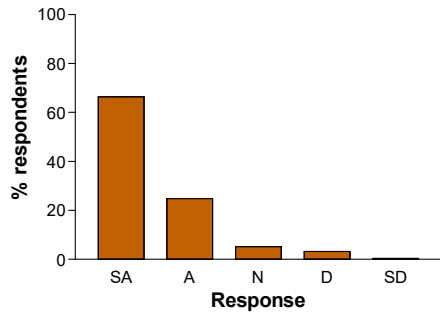


Community-based efforts to keep streets and other public places free of litter, builder's rubble and garden refuse should be supported

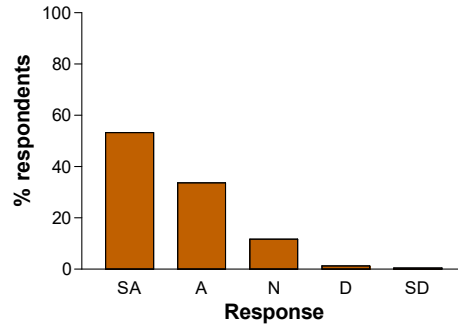

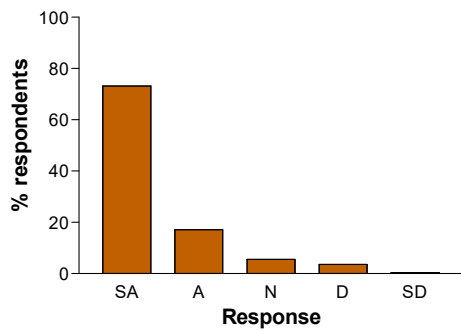
Every home should have animal-proof garbage containers



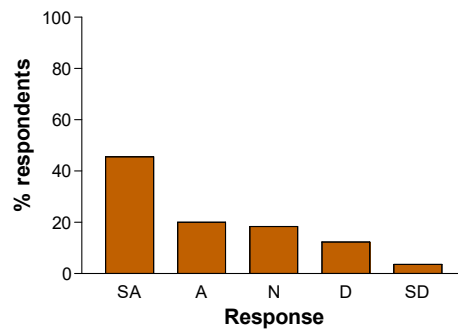
My house is willing to participate in a garbage-recycling scheme for the village



No crackers or fireworks should be permitted in Cape St Francis under any circumstances

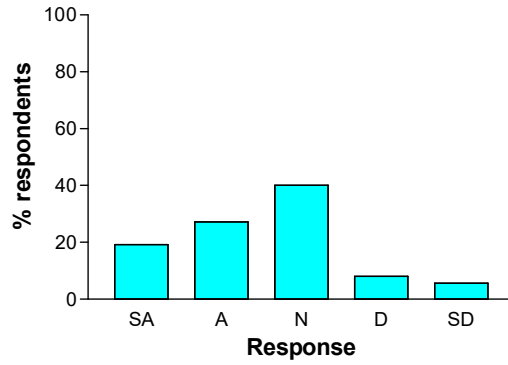


No dogs should be allowed on the beach in the swimming area during the holiday seasons (Dec/Jan & Easter)

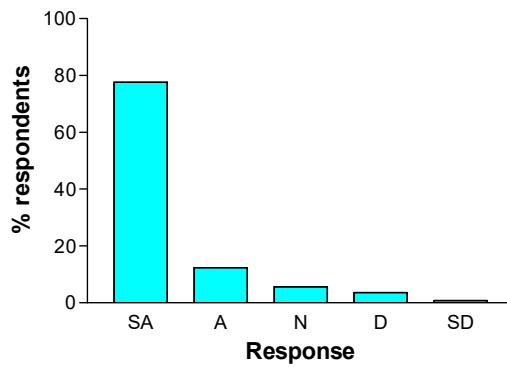


Keep it small 1

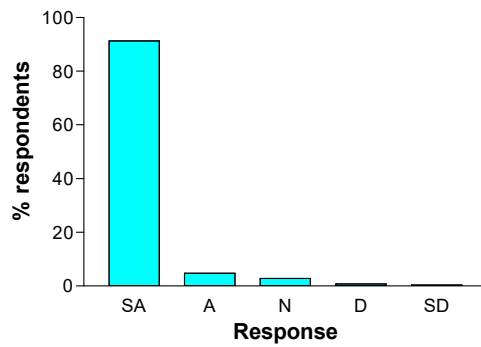
There should be a retirement village to serve Cape St Francis



No bottle store should be allowed in Cape St Francis

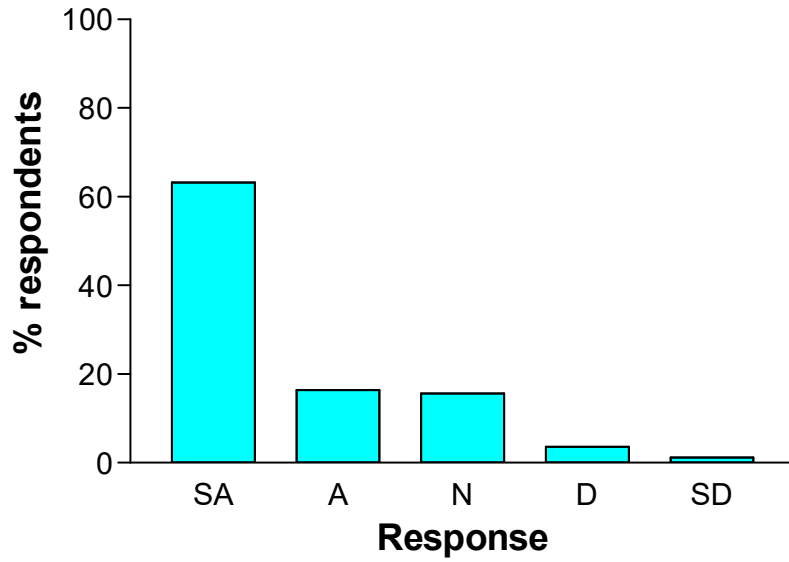


No road should be developed to link Cape St Francis with St Francis Bay via the Cape St Francis Nature Reserve
